ORDER

No. 839 Date 01-08-2020

In pursuance to the orders issued by the National Executive Committee regarding revised guidelines vide ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India order No.40-3/2020-DM-I(A) dated 29-07-2020 to extend the lockdown in containment zones upto 31.08.2020, and to re-open more activities in outside the containment zones and orders issued by the Government of Odisha, vide Revenue & Disaster Management (Disaster Management) department Order No:- 4582/R&DM(DM), dt. 31-07-2020 regarding promulgation of guidelines until midnight of 31-08-2020 and after careful consideration of the directives given by the Government from time to time with maintenance of strict Social Distancing Protocol in order to contain spread of COVID-19, the following stipulations are given for Jagatsinghpur district:

This order will come into force with effect from 01.08.2020.

N.B.:-There will be no Weekend Shutdown in Jagatsinghpur district as of now.

1. COVID Management Strategy

The COVID Management strategy is based on:

- De-centralized management: Empowered COVID Management Committee in urban and rural areas, headed by the Ward Members/ Ward Officers for extensive surveillance and monitoring for containing the spread of the disease
- Testing in accordance with ICMR guidelines
- Concurrent SARI/ ILI survey by H&FW Dept., Govt. of Odisha
- Management of COVID Care Homes at Gram Panchayat (GP)/ Ward level as holding areas for isolation and testing of symptomatic persons

- e) Continuance of Temporary Medical Camps (TMCs) for a cluster of GPs for quarantining
- f) Management of COVID Care Centres (CCC) in Govt., Corporate and Private sectors for isolation of mild and asymptomatic cases
- g) Management of dedicated COVID Health Centres (CHC) and COVID Hospitals in Govt. and private sectors. as well as under Public Private Partnership (PPP) mode for treatment of moderate to severe cases
- h) Home isolation for mild and asymptomatic cases, wherever feasible
- i) Strict monitoring of persons in home isolation by Local Authorities
- j) Strict enforcement of social distancing, mask wearing and spitting regulations in all public places
- k) Strict adherence of COVID SOP by all health facilities
- l) COVID Audit of Government and Private offices and obligation of the head of the office under Disaster Management Act, 2005 for enforcing physical distancing and mask wearing

2. Lockdown Guidelines:-

Lockdown will be limited to Containment zones only. At present there is no Containment zone in jagatsinghpur district. If in future any containment zone will be declared, then all the guidelines stipulated by Govt. of Odisha will be applicable.

3. Regulation of activities in areas outside the Containment Zones

The following establishments/ activities will continue to remain closed till 31stAugust, 2020, throughout Jagatsinghpur district:

- (i) Religious places/ places of worship for public
- (ii) International air travel of passengers, except as permitted by MHA
- (iii) Cinema halls, swimming pools. entertainment complexes, theatres, bars, auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places
- (iv) Social/ political/ sports/ entertainment/ academic/ cultural/ religious functions and other large congregations
- (v) Schools, colleges, other educational/ training/ coaching institutions, anganwaadis, etc. will remain closed for the purpose of teaching till 31stAugust, 2020. However, conduct of examinations, evaluation and other administrative activities shall be allowed.
- (vi) Hotels and Restaurants **with permission** are allowed to operate as per SOPs issued by MoHFW, Government of India. Restaurant service of the hotel will be open only for in-house guests.
- (vii) Restaurants and Hotels **with permission** will be allowed are for home delivery/ takeaways of food.



4. NOT ALLOWED TO OPEN:-

- Tea Stall / Hotel (without permission)/ Restaurants & Sweet Stalls (without permission) / Gymnasium / Swimming pool / Fast Food (Thella) / Street side Food/ Street side Tiffin stalls/ Betel (Pan) shop, Tobacco, Ghutaka, Chewing gum and any food items promoting spitting shall remain closed.
- The above types of shops are not permitted to open in view of apprehension of failure to maintain Social Distancing Protocol to contain the spread of COVID-19.

N.B.

1- For permission to open **restaurants/ sweet stalls** with home delivery & takeaway facility without on plate services in the premises, they have to apply **before concerned Tahasildars**.

2- To open **Hotel**, the permission has to be accorded by **Collector and District Magistrate, Jagatsinghpur**.

5. ALLOWED TO OPEN

- i. The Pharmaceutical (Medicine) shops shall remain open without any restricted timing.
- ii. All other permitted shops including essential shops shall remain open with restricted time limit from **07.00 AM to 02.00 PM** with strict maintenance of social distancing, strict personal hygiene measures including wearing of facemasks.
- iii. All types of movements of goods through carrier vehicles either loaded or unloaded and movement of vehicles for essential services are allowed.
- iv. Use of Mask is mandatory in case of any customer found not wearing mask inside the shop or in front of the shop the concerned shop keeper will be fined.

6. Night Curfew

All shops, commercial establishments, offices, institutions and movement of individuals shall remain closed/ prohibited between **09.00 PM to 05.00 AM** throughout the district except for essential activities under section 144 of Cr.P.C.

This restriction shall not apply to

- District and Municipal Administration/ Police/ Government Officials on duty
- Doctors, Medical/ Paramedical Staff (Govt. & Private), ambulances and emergency health staff
- Emergency workers of Utilities such as Electricity, Telecom, Water Supply, Railways and Airport
- Staff of **IT & ITeS** Companies on production their ID cards


- Any person, in case of medical or other emergency
- Owner/ staff of chemist shops
- All industrial units
- All construction activities
- Movement of public transport, private vehicles and taxis (including cabs by aggregators like Ola, Uber, etc.) to and from airports, railway station and bus terminals/ stands/ stops, for facilitating movement of passengers by air, rail and road
- Operation of hotels and hospitality units. including their associated offices, movement of staff and associated personnel
- Dhabas (with permission) along National and State Highways/ Major roads for takeaway only
- Petrol pumps and CNG Stations
- Print and Electronic Media identified by Commissionerate/ District Police

7. Economy & Livelihood

Subject to the clause No-6, there shall be no restriction on activities and movement of goods and personnel related to economic and livelihood activities, including shops and establishments, dealing with Agriculture, Horticulture, Fisheries, Animal Husbandry, Dairy and allied activities, Mining & Industries, Construction work, Service Sector units, etc.

8. Functioning of Offices

- Govt. Offices:** Govt. offices shall function with reduced manpower, in accordance with the notification issued by GA&PG Department, Govt. of Odisha from time to time.
- Banks and FIs:** Banks and Financial Institutions shall function with reduced manpower, in accordance with the notification issued by Finance Department, Govt. of Odisha.
- Private Offices:** Private offices shall operate with reduced manpower and as far as feasible, adopt Work from Home (WfH) practice.
- Obligation of Heads of Offices:** All offices, Government and Private, must ensure adherence to the SOP on preventive measures to contain spread of COVID-19 in offices issued by Department of H&FW, Government of Odisha dated 30th June **2020**. Non-adherence to these guidelines will invite action under appropriate provisions of Disaster Management Act, 2005.
- Staggering of work/ business hours will be followed in offices, work places, shops, markets and industrial & commercial establishments.



- f. Screening & hygiene: Provision for thermal screening, hand wash and sanitizer will be made at all entry and exit points and common areas.
- g. Frequent sanitization of entire workplace, common facilities and all points which come into human contact e.g. door handles, etc., will be ensured, including between shifts.
- h. Physical distancing: All persons in charge of workplaces will ensure adequate distance between workers, adequate gaps between shifts, staggering the lunch breaks of staff, etc.

9. General Directives for COVID-19 Management

The following General Directives for COVID-19 Management shall be strictly followed throughout the State:

- a. Face coverings/ Masks: Wearing of face cover/ mask properly is compulsory in public places: in workplaces: and in public transport(Annexure-II).
- b. Social distancing: Individuals must maintain a minimum distance of 6 feet in public places.
- c. Shops and Commercial Establishments/ Institutions will ensure physical distancing and use of face cover/ mask by employees and customers. The onus of compliance to the guidelines on wearing of face cover/ mask, social distancing, etc. lies with the owner of the shop/ commercial establishment, who shall be liable for any violation which may lead to imposition of fines and other penal actions including closure/ sealing of the premises by the Local Authority.
- d. Salons, Spas, Beauty Parlours and Barber shops shall ensure all safety precautions. Disinfection and sanitization before and after service of each customer. The onus of compliance to the guideline lies with the owner, who shall be liable for any violation which may lead to penal action including closure/ sealing of the premises.
- e. Large Public gatherings/ congregations are prohibited.
- f. Marriage related gatherings shall not exceed 50 persons. Funeral/ last rites related gatherings shall not exceed 20 persons
- g. Spitting in public places will be punishable with fine, as prescribed in accordance with laws, rules or regulations.
- h. Consumption of liquor, pawn, gutka, tobacco, etc in public places is prohibited.

10. Movement of persons and goods

- a. There shall be no restriction on inter-State and intra-state movement of goods and private vehicles. No **permission/ approval/ e-permit/ passes** **will be required for such movements.**

- b. Inter-State and Intra-State movement of Passenger Buses will be regulated by Transport Commissioner.
 - c. Movement by passenger trains and Shramik special **trains**; domestic passenger air travel; movement of Indian Nationals stranded outside the country and of specified persons to travel **abroad** ; evacuation of foreign nationals: and sign-on and sign-off of Indian seafarers will continue to be regulated as per SOPs issued by Govt. of India.
11. Based on their assessment of the situation, Collector and District Magistrate, Jagatsinghpur may impose area-specific reasonable restrictions on activities outside the Containment zones or impose such restrictions as deemed necessary for containing the spread of COVID-19.

12. Safety and Protection of vulnerable persons

The following categories of people are advised against outdoor movement, except for essential and health purposes till 31st August, 2020.

- a. Persons above 65 years of age
- b. persons with co-morbidities
- c. pregnant women
- d. children below the age of 10 years

13. Use of Aarogya Setu

- (i) *Aarogya Setu* enables early identification of potential risk of infection, and thus acts as a shield for individuals and the community.
- (ii) With a view to ensuring safety in offices and workplaces, employers on best effort basis should ensure that *Aarogya Setu* is installed by all employees having compatible mobile phones.
- (iii) District authorities may advise individuals to install the *Aarogya Setu* application on compatible mobile phones and regularly update their health status on the app. This will facilitate timely provision of medical attention to those individuals who are at risk.

14. Strict enforcement of the guidelines


- (i) These guidelines issued under the Disaster Management Act, 2005, shall not be diluted in any manner.
- (ii) All the District Magistrates/ Municipal Commissioners/ Commissioner of Police, Bhubaneswar-Cuttack shall strictly enforce the above measures.



15. Penal provisions


Any person violating these measures will be liable to be proceeded against in accordance with the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under Section 188 of the IPC, and other legal provisions as applicable.

This order will come into force with immediate effect, i.e., from 01.08.2020 to till further orders.


